If arriving from Hilo:

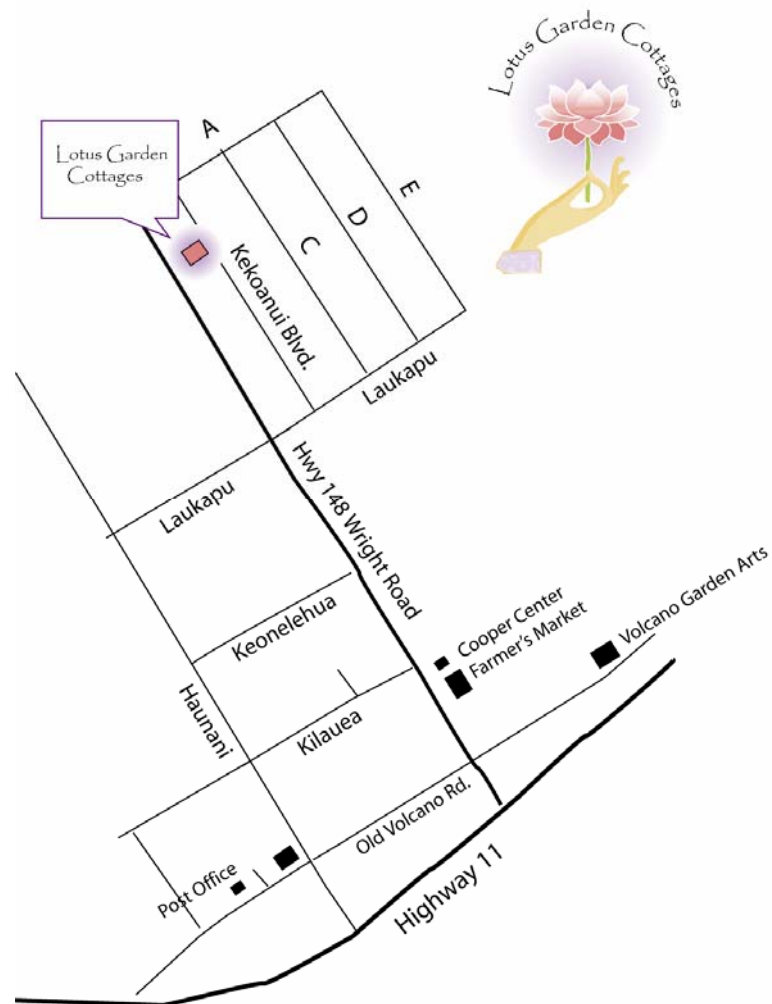
Hilo airport (ITO) is the closest airport to Lotus Garden Cottages and a short 28 mile scenic drive. Simply turn left upon leaving Hilo airport onto Highway 11.

Follow 11 out of Hilo. After Hilo you will go through the small towns of Kea'au , Kurtistown and Mountain View . As you approach Volcano you will see the signs for Volcano Village. At the sign for Wright Road turn right. Travel three quarters of a mile, and turn right again at Laukapu St . Your first left will be Ke Koa Nui Blvd (Road B) and Lotus Garden Cottages will be just down the road on your left hand side.

If arriving from Kona:

Kona airport (KOA) is about a 2 hour drive to Lotus Garden Cottages. After leaving the airport turn right onto Highway 11.

Take 11 through the towns of Kailua Kuna, Captain Cook, and down through South Point continuing on through Na'alehu , Honu'apo and Pahala . After awhile you will begin to see signs for Volcanoes National Park. You will go past the Park entrance and will immediately see a sign for Volcano Village. Continue past the sign and turn left onto Wright Road. Travel three quarters of a mile, and turn right again at Laukapu St, Your first left will be Ke Koa Nui Blvd (Road B) and Lotus Garden Cottages will be about one half mile down the road on your left hand side.



The Area

Volcano Village



The outlying community is a mix of scientists, artists and local entrepreneurs in a village-like town with a variety of restaurants and cafes. The village and its surrounding inhabitants blend almost imperceptibly into the native-forested landscape. The whole area has been designated by the United Nations as an International Biosphere Reserve and Historic Site.



Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, established in 1916, displays the results of 70 million years of volcanism, migration, and evolution --

processes that thrust a bare land from the sea and clothed it with complex and unique ecosystems and a distinct human culture. The park encompasses diverse environments that range from sea level to the summit of the earth's most massive volcano, Mauna Loa at 13,677 feet. Kilauea, the world's most active volcano, offers scientists insights on the birth of the Hawaiian Islands and visitors views of dramatic volcanic landscapes.

Over half of the park is designated wilderness and provides unusual hiking and camping opportunities. In recognition of its outstanding natural values, Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park has been honored as an International Biosphere Reserve and a World Heritage Site.



The Climate



The park has distinct climate zones that vary according to elevation. Visitors should be prepared for a wide range of weather conditions.

Weather at the summit of Kilauea (4,000' elevation) fluctuates daily and can be rainy and chilly any time of the year. Temperature varies by elevation and it is generally 14 degrees cooler at the summit than it is at sea level. The coastal plain at the end of Chain of Craters Road is often hot, dry, and windy. Bring rain gear, light sweaters or jackets, sturdy shoes, hats, water bottles, sun glasses and high UV factor sunscreen. For the island weather forecast, call (808) 961-5582.
